**Uranium Substitute**  
NEW DELHI, Jan. 19 — (AP) —  
The annual output of the monazite sands factory in southwest India will be 207 tons of thorium nitrate, used as a substitute for uranium, 1,500 tons of rare earth chlorides and 1,800 tons of trisodium phosphate, Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru said.  
Nehru added that the government had received reports of the existence of monazite sands in other parts of India but would postpone erection of factories in those areas until the southwest India deposits had been fully exploited.
