

How to use this Open Educational Resource

This Open Educational Resource is in .pdf format. It uses sound within the PDF to demonstrate pronunciations. This document can be viewed with any PDF reader from any operative system. However, to be able to listen to the audios, Acrobat Reader (free) is recommended. Once you have open the document in Acrobat Reader, you may need to allow for permission to play the audio. Each audio is signaled with rectangle around a music note. By placing the cursor on top of it, a hand symbol will appear and if you click then, the audio will play.

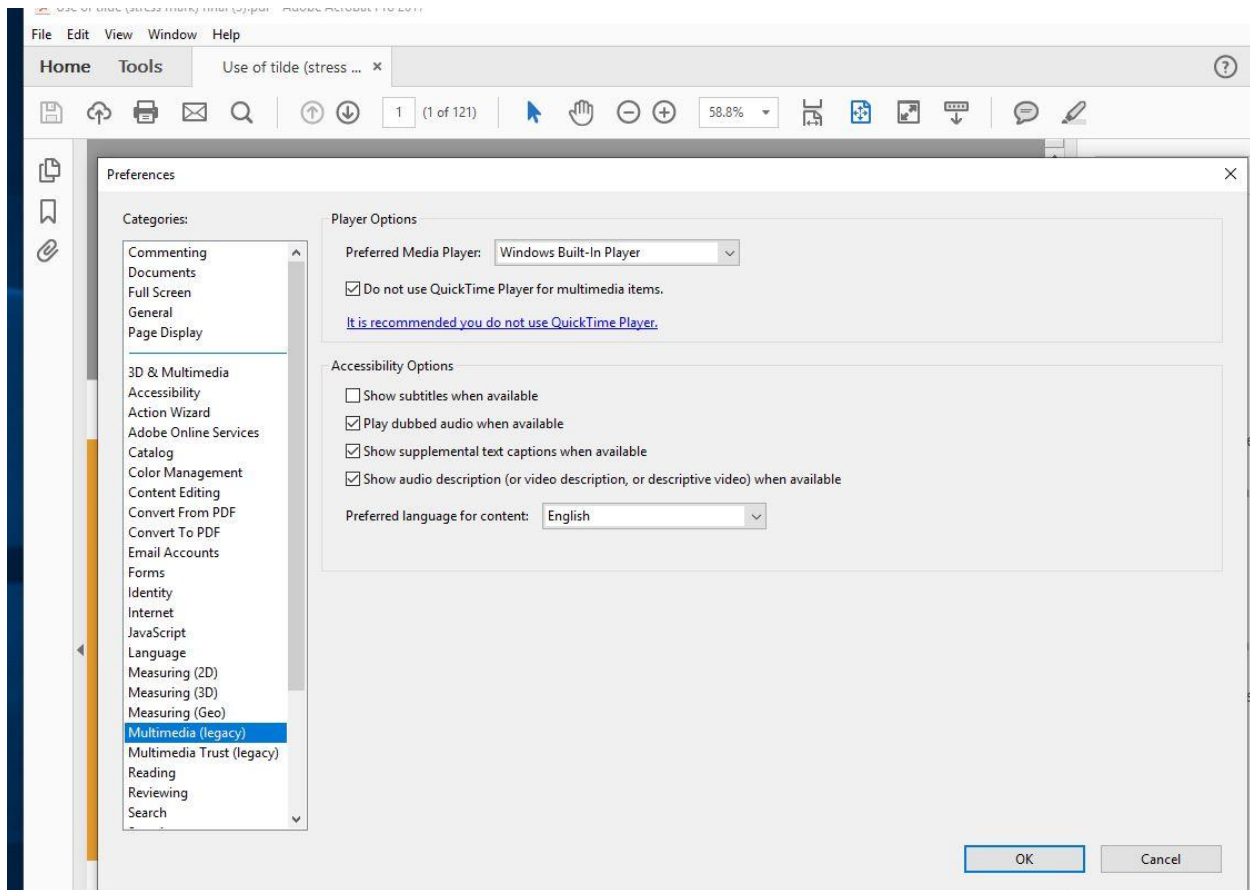

Please follow these steps to enable sound in Adobe Reader.

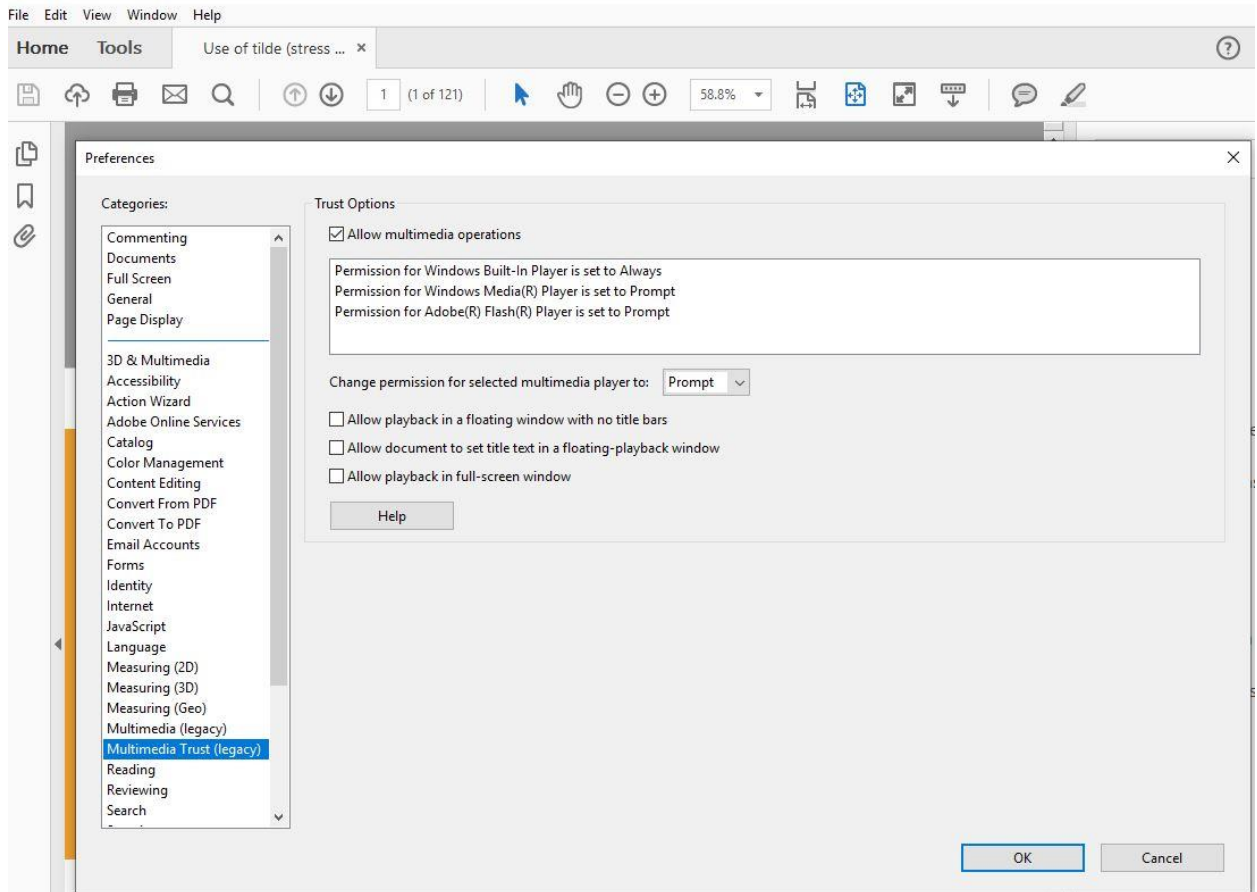
1. Open the Adobe Reader application on your computer.
2. Click on “Preferences” under “Edit” in Adobe Reader.
3. Open the Preferences dialog box, and then select Multimedia (Legacy) from the left side of the dialog box.



4. **Player Options-** Choose the format in which you want to run legacy media content: QuickTime, Flash, Windows Media, or Windows built-in player. Windows built-in player is suggested.

Accessibility Options- Specify if you want special features (if available) to appear when media plays, such as subtitles and dubbed audio. Specify the preferred language for the media, in case multiple languages are available.

5. In the Preferences dialog box, select “Multimedia Trust (legacy)” from the left side of the dialog box



6. Select “Allow multimedia operations” and adjust permissions so that Permission for Windows Built-In Player is set to Always and the other multimedia player options are set to Prompt.
